I will not fear, for you are ever with me. and you will never leave me to face my perils alone."

We will continue to celebrate indoor, inperson worship this summer, as more and more people are feeling comfortable enough to join together. # **Lenten Groups 2021**

This spring, in the interest of finding new ways to connect before we were able to see each other in person, the church offered a variety of groups led by congregation members. There was everything from baking and photography to gardening, wine tasting, and Mario Kart. Groups like this may seem to have had nothing to do with a season that's supposed to be all about repentance. But...the word repentance means to turn, to see something differently, and in doing so we see God more clearly. Each of the groups offered an invitation to see something differently, to fill our mind, body, or spirit with something that might be life-giving for the year to come. Some of us needed intellectual stimulation, others an invitation to get

outside, and still others the chance to laugh and enjoy fellowship with their church family. We had 14 groups with over 90 participants. It was a joy to connect, grow and laugh together.







### **Matthew 25**

Thanks to the overwhelming generosity of First Pres members, 2021's Matthew 25 campaign was a great success. To date \$45,035 has been raised for neighbors experiencing housing insecurity, blowing away our \$25,000 Lenten goal. These gifts have allowed us to give much-needed funding to Friends Association and Kennett Area Community Services, two agencies on the front lines of the housing crisis. It will also enable First Pres to expand our Graduation Grant program for West Chester University students served by the Promise Program, which supports those who are homeless or who have aged out of foster care. Remaining funds will be distributed to neighbors with urgent housing or transportation needs who cannot be served by existing agencies.

At Friends Association, your gifts were directed toward the Eviction Prevention program, assisting families at risk of eviction with emergency housing payments, mediation, and crafting solutions that protect both renters and landlords. Kennett Area Community Services provides support to those experiencing homelessness and other housing-related struggles, in addition to operating a food pantry that serves many Southern Chester County families. Graduating Promise Program students work with WCU staff on a grant application for essentials they will need after leaving undergrad, including first month's rent and security deposits, transportation, and moving expenses.

Last year's Matthew 25 funding helped First Pres to offer support to dozens of local families struggling with lack of housing, back utility bills, and healthcare concerns. While Chester County boasts excellent nonprofit agencies, there are many who fall through the cracks because their situations do not fall into the exact criteria needed to receive agency support. First Pres members were able to move a young mother from a motel into an apartment, helped with transportation costs so that families could

make it to work, and provided emergency utility supports.

## **Per Capita Giving**

#### What is Per Capita Giving and What Does it do?

"Per Capita" is a Latin term that translates to "by head." Our Per Capita is \$35.38 per "head" or member. All Presbyterian churches contribute to Per Capita because it supports our denomination regionally, nationally, and internationally. Locally, Donegal Presbytery uses Per Capita funds to support mission projects in our area, around the country, and world-wide. The Presbytery also provides programs of national interest by respected authorities on various topics. In addition, Per Capita allows our Presbytery to provide legal and advisory support to Donegal Presbytery churches with challenges they face, pandemic issues, and difficult situations that require additional support. We respectfully ask you to contribute \$35.38 for each church member in your house to cover your portion of this shared ministry. First Pres pays the full per capita amount of about \$40k to Donegal Presbytery regardless of amounts contributed by our members. Any shortfall then reduces amounts available for mission and ministry. While \$35.38 may seem like a small amount, it can be cost-prohibitive for some of our members. If you are able to provide a per capita payment for a member unable to do so, it will help the church allocate more of our general operating funds for local mission. Thank you for your support.

# **Anti-Racism Photo Project**

Last summer, members of First Pres participated in three book studies to learn about the presence of racism in our country. One church member was inspired by the conversations to create a Racial Justice Journeys photo essay. He invited members of the book groups to write their "aha" moments, to share when and how they came to recognize racism more fully around them and how they responded. These photo essays are now posted on the church's website at <a href="firstpreswc.com/racial-justice-journeys">firstpreswc.com/racial-justice-journeys</a>. The participants shared them with the public in hopes that those who look at them will know that there is plenty of grace-filled space in our church community for self-reflection, learning and repentance. As individuals share their learnings and the ways they are growing with others, we hope to collectively become a force that more effectively advocates for God's love and justice in our community, our country and our world.





### Deacons

In 2021 the First Pres Deacons moved to a new ministry model, taking back up the parish ministry structure that the church previously used. The groups of households, or parishes, are each served by a deacon who serves as an ongoing source of care and connection with the church. Parishes are organized not only by geography but also by life stage (for example, families with young children, or neighbors in a particular retirement community) and interest (music ministry). While this model is still only a few months old, the benefits are already clear as relationships between members are strengthened and new friendships are formed. Thank you to our deacons for your care and enthusiasm in this ministry, and to all our members who have so warmly received their calls, letters, and emails.

## **Music Ministry Plans**

The program year 2020/2021 was like no other year before. I like to use the description "the year of tentative planing in an ever changing world." However, I am still grateful for this past program year because it showed me the dedication level of those involved in the music ministry. First Pres would not have been able to have a versatile and high level musical offerings on Sunday mornings or a fully prerecorded Candlelight Christmas Concert without the 50 plus volunteers who were willing to attend weekly rehearsals even during pandemic times. Together we made possible what other churches could not dream about this past season. Thank you all from the bottom of my heart. Special thanks to Eric Hankins, Creative Arts Director, who was in charge of the recordings. Because of his service and commitment he was granted a honorary membership from all of the instrumental groups.

The summer months are around the corner and summer is traditionally the time of making plans for the new season. Trust me, I am never short of plans. The question is whether we will be able to execute the plans. I believe that with God's help we will.

## **Women's Bible Study**

This spring, 18 women joined together over Zoom for six weeks as we discussed the book, "In His Image: 10 Ways God Calls Us to Reflect His Character." Our group isn't limited to First Pres members or even people who live locally – we've had participants from other churches and other states! We learned more about each other, learned how to become more Christ-like, and spent lots of time in laughter and conversation. We hope to have a women's get-together this summer; stay tuned for more info.
