Medical Clinic in Guatemala



Our sisters and brothers at Getsemani in Guatemala have a wonderful Community Medical Clinic ministry. Access to quality health care and medicine in Guatemala is very limited with many people having never seen a doctor. The Deacons at Getsemani provide up to four Medical Clinics per year with three being in their community and one at a remote location. The clinics are promoted and open to everyone. Already this year they have had two medical clinics for deworming children and adults. They handed out vitamins and other medicines they need.

The first clinic was with a group of children for which Getsemani Church has responsibility. They meet in the home of a family of the church every month and are given a biblical teaching and snack. The group has been growing and they hope in God



that the seeds of the Gospel are sown and germinate in the families of these children. The second clinic was at the Port of San Jose Escuintla where they served twenty families.

First Pres helps supports this tremendous ministry of Getsemani through prayer, financial contribution, and sending of over-the-counter medicines each year.
