Presbyterian Disaster Assistance



On April 14, a 6.5 magnitude earthquake hit Kumamoto, Japan, followed two days later with an even stronger quake. All told, 41 people died in the combined events. On April 16, Ecuador experienced a 7.8 magnitude

earthquake. Current estimates list at least 413 people killed and over 2,500 injured; getting rescue crews to some of the most devastated areas has been difficult due to flooded roads and downed communication lines.

As the country heals from this extraordinary devastation, international aid will be crucial in setting up medical clinics, food, and shelter for survivors. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, in concert with Church World Service, is already on the ground in both Ecuador and Japan with emergency assistance.

First Presbyterian Church has already made a \$5,000 donation to support the PDA's emergency relief efforts in Ecuador and Japan. It is a testament to the members of this congregation that we were able to respond so quickly through rapid action of the Service & Outreach team. If you
